Appendix 1

Explanatory

Notes:

Resolution 1: To Receive and Adopt the Annual Report and Accounts

The Directors of the Company are required to lay the Annual Report and Accounts before the shareholders each year at the AGM. Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution to receive and adopt the Company's Annual Report and Accounts for the financial year ended 31 December 2014.

Resolution 2: To declare a Final Dividend

The Board has recommended that a final dividend for the year ended 31 December 2014 of 7.5 pence per share be declared payable on 24 June 2015 to shareholders whose names appear on the register of members of the Company at the close of business on 29 May 2015. An interim dividend of 5 pence per share was paid on 31 October 2014, making a total dividend for the year of 12.5 pence per share.

Resolutions 3, 4, and 5: Re-appointment of Directors

The Company's Articles of Association require that at every AGM any Director who shall have been a Director at each of the preceding two AGMs, retire from office and, if appropriate, seek re-appointment. This year, Howard Nicholson and Nurlan Zhakupov retire and ordinary resolutions 3, and 4 are for their re-appointment. In addition, any Director appointed by the Board since the last AGM retires, and, if appropriate, seeks re-appointment. David Swan was appointed as a Director by the Board since last year's AGM and ordinary resolution 5 is for his re-appointment. Biographical details of all the Directors standing for re-election appear on pages 34 and 35 of the Annual Report and Accounts for the financial year ended 31 December 2014.

Resolution 6: Re-appointment of Auditors

The Company's Auditors are required to be re-appointed at every AGM. Resolution 6 is an ordinary resolution to approve the re-appointment of Pricewaterhouse Coopers LLP as Auditors.

Resolution 7: Auditors' Remuneration

This resolution is to authorise the Directors, as is customary, to negotiate and agree the remuneration of the Auditors of the Company. In practice, the Audit Committee will consider and approve the audit fees on behalf of the Directors.

Resolution 8: Allotment of Relevant Securities

Your Directors may allot shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert any security into, shares only if authorised to do so by shareholders. The authority granted at the last AGM is due to expire at this year's AGM. Accordingly, Resolution 8 will be proposed as an ordinary resolution to grant new authorities to allot shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert any security into, shares. If given, these authorities will expire at the conclusion of the AGM in 2016 or on 30 June 2016, whichever is the earlier.

Paragraph (a) of Resolution 8 will allow the directors to allot ordinary shares up to a maximum nominal amount of US\$371,862, representing approximately one third (33.33 per cent.) of the Company's existing issued share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 15 May 2015 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of this notice). In accordance with the latest institutional guidelines issued by The Investment Association, paragraph (b) of Resolution 8 will also allow Directors to allot, including the ordinary shares referred to in paragraph (a) of Resolution 8, further ordinary shares in connection with a pre-emptive offer by way of a rights issue to ordinary shareholders up to a maximum nominal amount of US\$743,724, representing approximately two thirds (66.67 per cent.) of the Company's existing issued share capital as at 15 May 2015.

It is customary for a UK quoted company to maintain such an authority irrespective of any intention to exercise it. The Directors confirm that they do not currently have any intention to exercise this authority. If they do exercise the authority, the Directors will have due regard to institutional shareholder guidelines regarding its use.

Resolution 9: Disapplication of Pre-emption Rights

Your Directors also require a power from shareholders to allot equity securities or sell treasury shares for cash and otherwise than to existing shareholders pro rata to their holdings. The power granted at the last AGM is due to expire at this year's AGM. Accordingly, Resolution 9 will be proposed as a special resolution to grant such a power.

Apart from offers or invitations in proportion to the respective number of shares held, the power will be limited to the allotment of equity securities and sales of treasury shares for cash up to an aggregate nominal value of US\$112,070 (being approximately 10 per cent. of the Company's issued ordinary share capital at 15 May 2015, the latest practicable date prior to publication of this notice). If given, this power will expire on 30 June 2016 or at the conclusion of the AGM in 2016, whicheveristhe earlier.

Your Directors will have due regard to institutional guidelines in relation to any exercise of this power. It is customary for a UK quoted company to maintain such an authority irrespective of any intention to exercise it. The Directors confirm that they do not currently have any intention to exercise this authority.

Resolution 10: Authority for the Company to Buy Back Shares

This resolution will give the Company authority to purchase its own shares in the market up to a limit of approximately 10 per cent of its issued ordinary share capital at 15 May 2015, the latest practicable date prior to the publication of the Notice of Meeting. The maximum and minimum prices are stated in the resolution. Whilst they do not currently have any intention to utilise this authority your Directors believe that it is advantageous for the Company to have this flexibility to make market purchases of its own shares as it did during 2012. Your Directors will exercise this authority only if they are satisfied that a purchase would result in an increase in expected earnings per share and would be in the interests of shareholders generally.

In the event that shares are purchased, they would either be cancelled (and the number of shares in issue would be reduced accordingly) or, in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, be retained as treasury shares. The Company may consider holding repurchased shares pursuant to the authority conferred by this resolution as treasury shares. This gives the Company the ability to transfer treasury shares quickly and cost effectively and would provide the Company with additional flexibility in the management of its capital base. Any issues of treasury shares for the purposes of the Company's employee share schemes will be made within the 10 per cent. anti-dilution limit set by The Investment Association.

Resolution 11: Dividend rectification

The Board has recently become aware of a technical issue in respect of the Company's procedure for the payment of the interim dividend of 4p per Ordinary Share which was declared in September 2013 (the "Interim Dividend"). The Company had sufficient distributable reserves to pay the Interim Dividend at the relevant time (and would do so at the date of this circular and, it is anticipated, at the date the proposed resolution will be voted upon) but interim accounts showing the requisite level of distributable reserves were not prepared and filed with the Registrar of Companies.in accordance with the Companies Act 2006. Consequently, this technical non-compliance with the statutory requirements could theoretically mean that the Company may have claims against past and present shareholders who were recipients of the Interim Dividend and/or against persons who were Directors at the time of payment of the Interim Dividend or who have subsequently become Directors.

In order to put these persons in the position they were always intended to be, it is proposed that this matter is remedied by the shareholders passing a resolution to ratify the Interim Dividend. It is not the intention of the Company that any claims should be made by the Company against either past and present shareholders who received the Interim Dividend or against the past or present Directors in respect of the dividend payments.

Therefore, Resolution 11 is being proposed as a special resolution to ratify and confirm the appropriation of profits to the payments concerned, to release claims which the Company may have either against such shareholders who received the Interim Dividend or against any such Directors and to approve the Company entering into a deed of release in favour of such shareholders and Directors.
